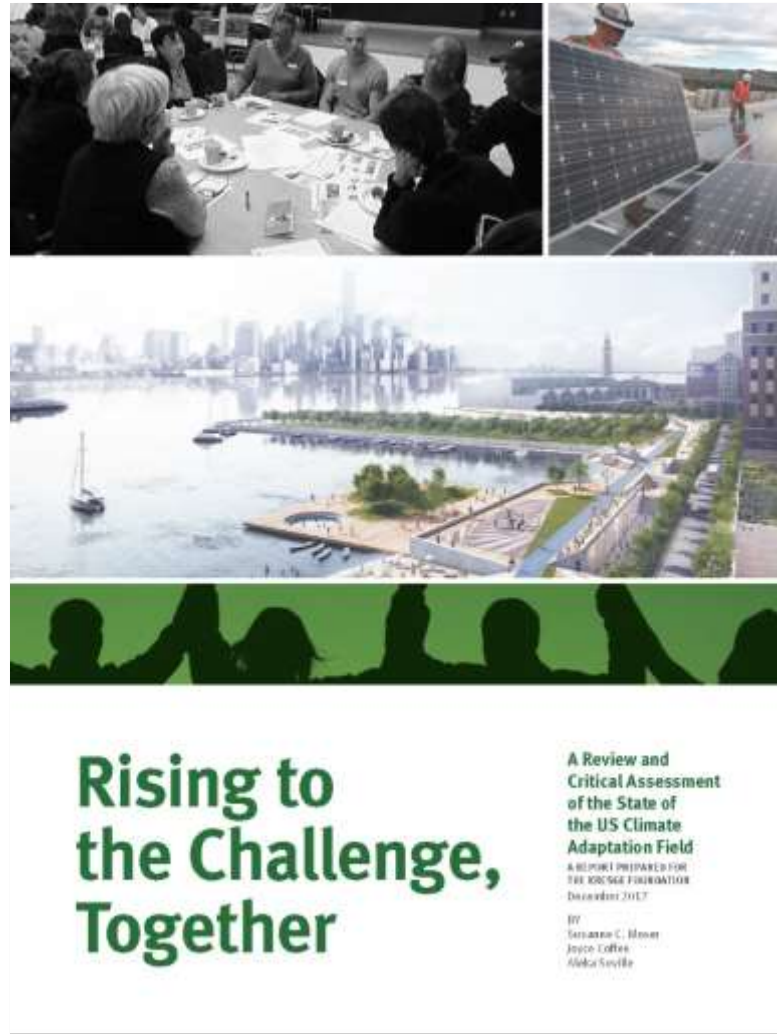

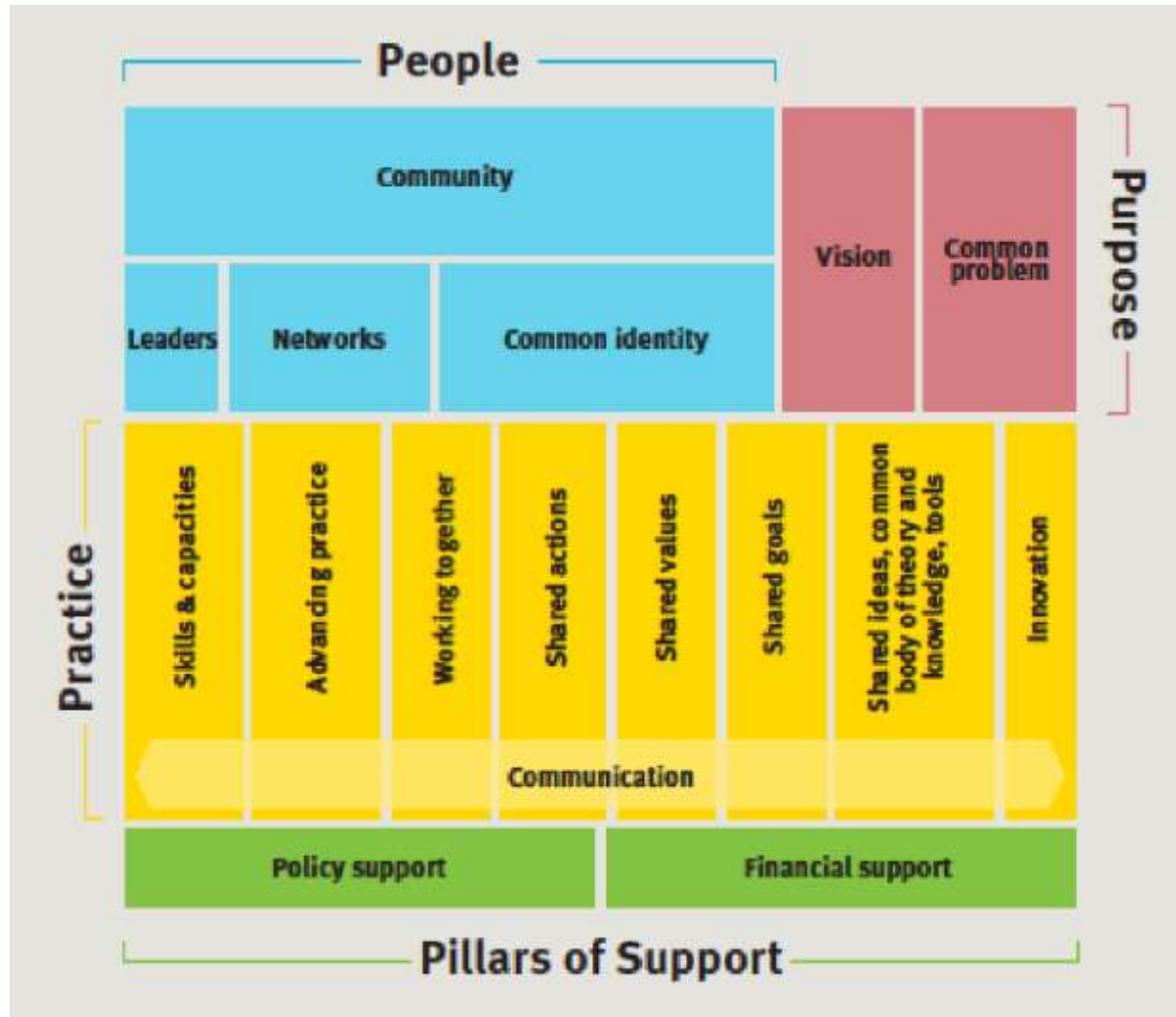
# Benefits of a Strong Field

- Necessary expertise & skilled workforce
- Clarity on good/best practices and tools, established as “common” practice
- Advancing shared goals and values
- Actor networks (professionals, partners, citizens)
- Ongoing learning
- Adequate training
- Political and public support
- Problems solved effectively, efficiently, and in an integrated manner
- Reduced societal burdens and maximized opportunities

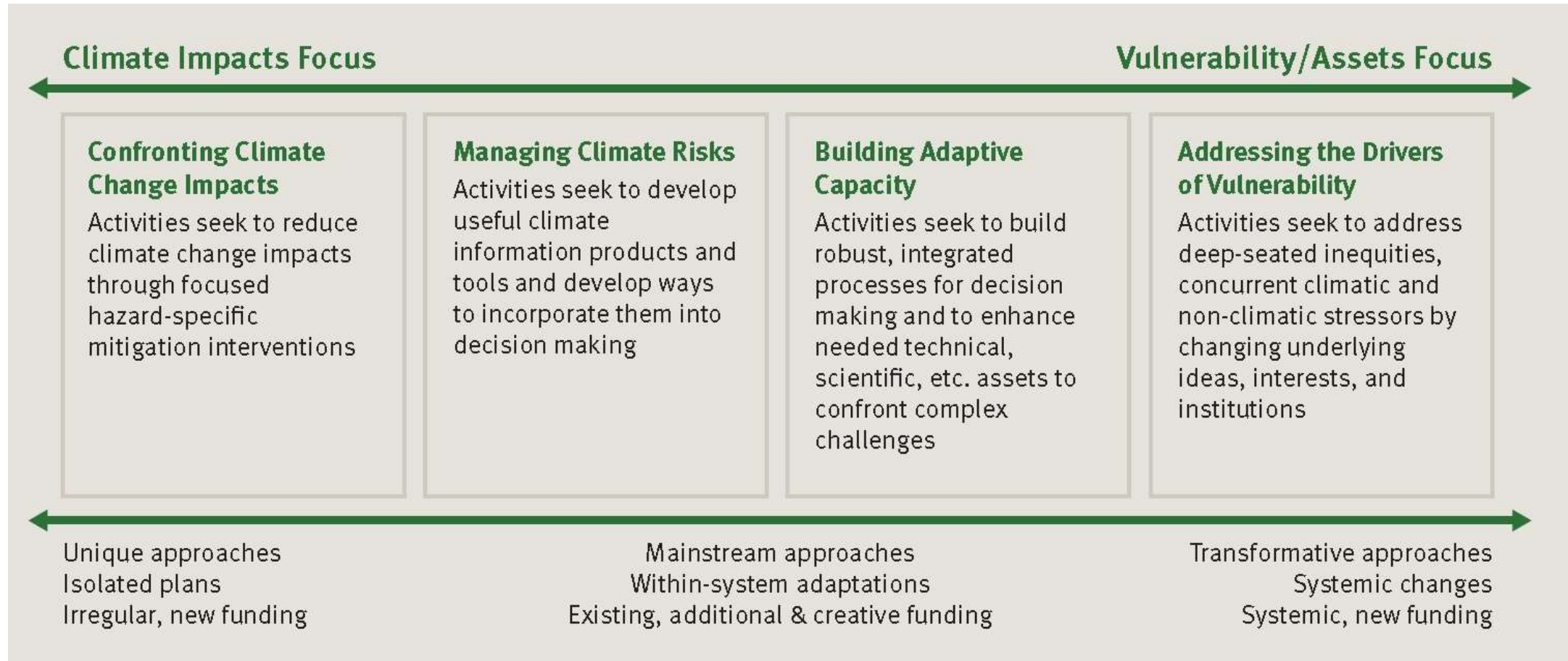
# The 4-P Field Framework



- **Purpose** – common problem understanding, unifying vision of a better future; shared values; agreed-upon priorities; shared sense of urgency
- **People** – adequate (growth in) numbers; requisite diversity of expertise; good networking; inclusivity; sectors, regions represented; recognizable leadership
- **Practices** – evidence-based “best practices”; prevailing focus of activity; progress matching scope of challenge; adequate communication; skill level among practitioners
- **Pillars of support** – diversity and adequacy of funding/ finance; continuity, coordination of funding streams; policy support at all levels; signals from highly visible leaders to take issue seriously; field-building support

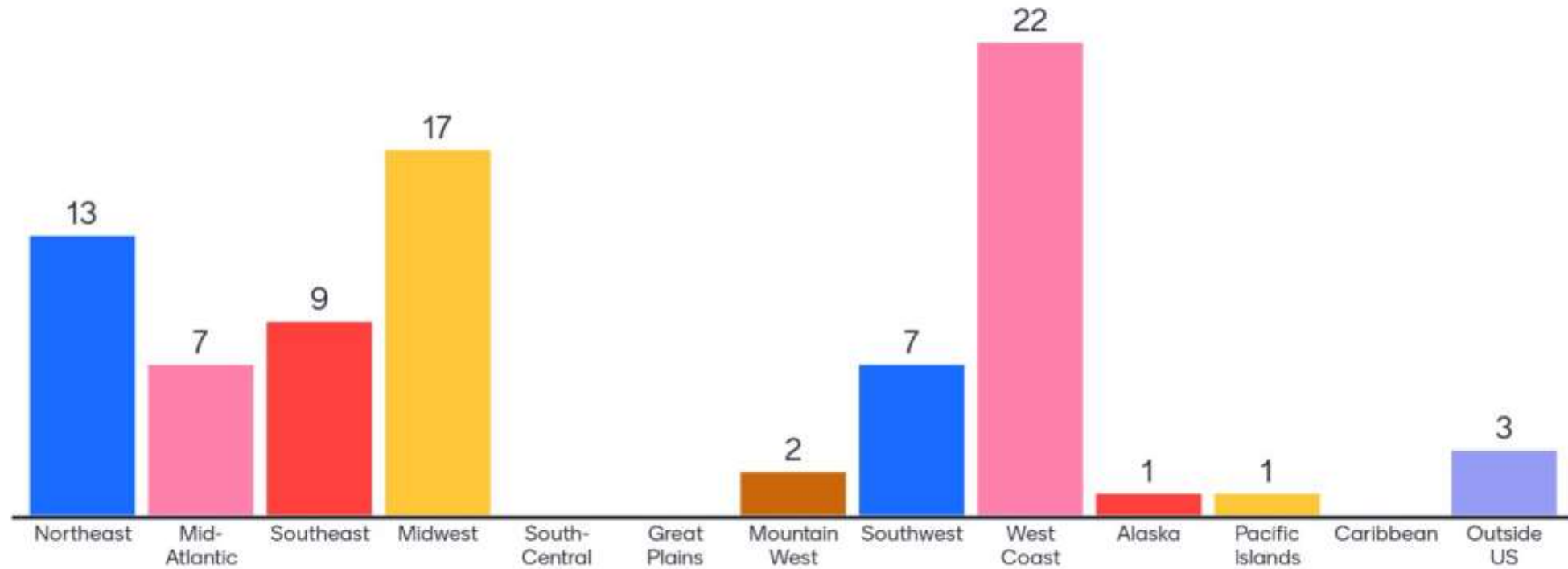

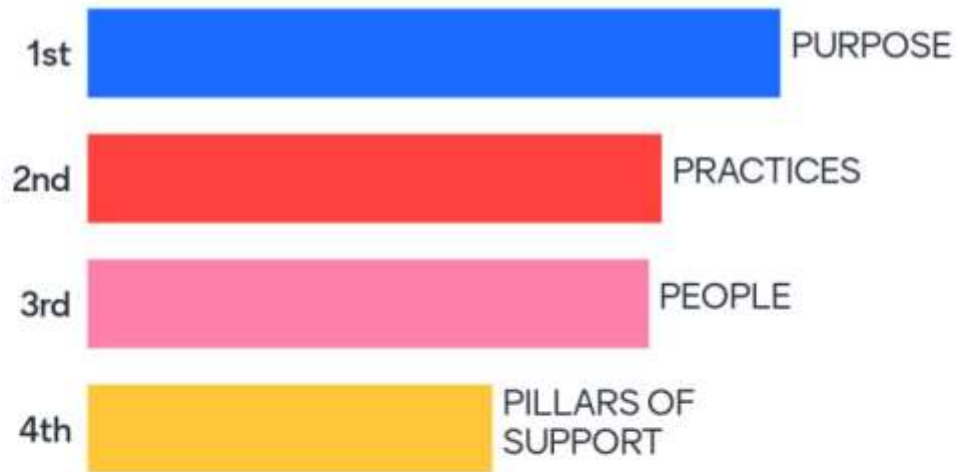
# The Current State of the US Adaptation Field



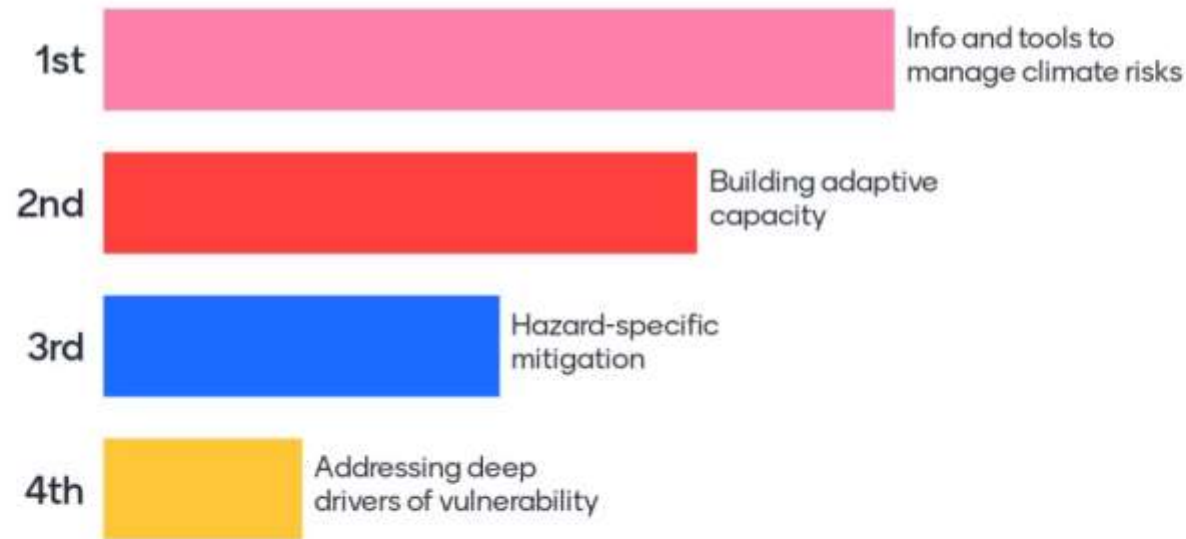
174 responses

# From your perspective, where does MOST adaptation in the US focus on at this time?

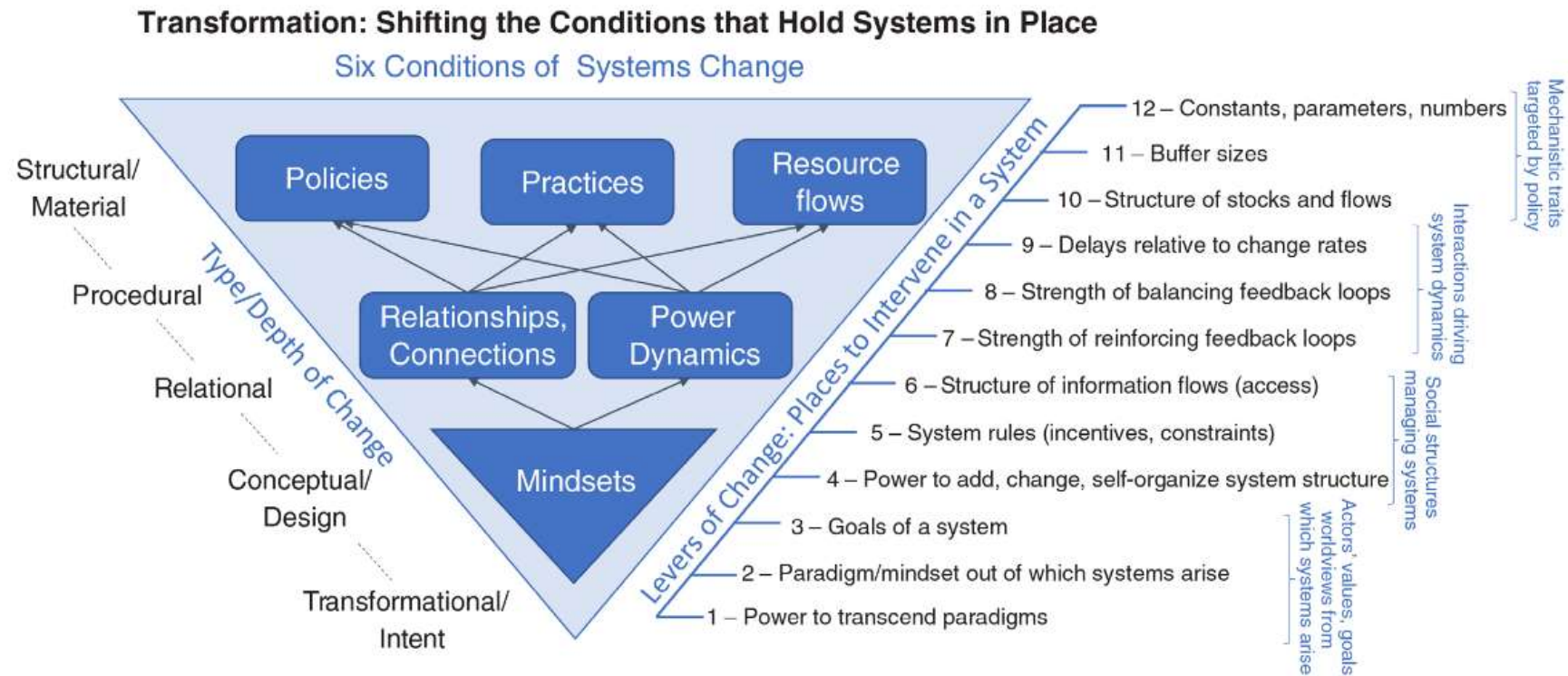

# Transformative Adaptation

## A possible definition

**Transformative adaptation** goes beyond adjusting existing systems for better fit with current and expected climate; it aims to change them fundamentally to address the root causes of vulnerability and injustice.

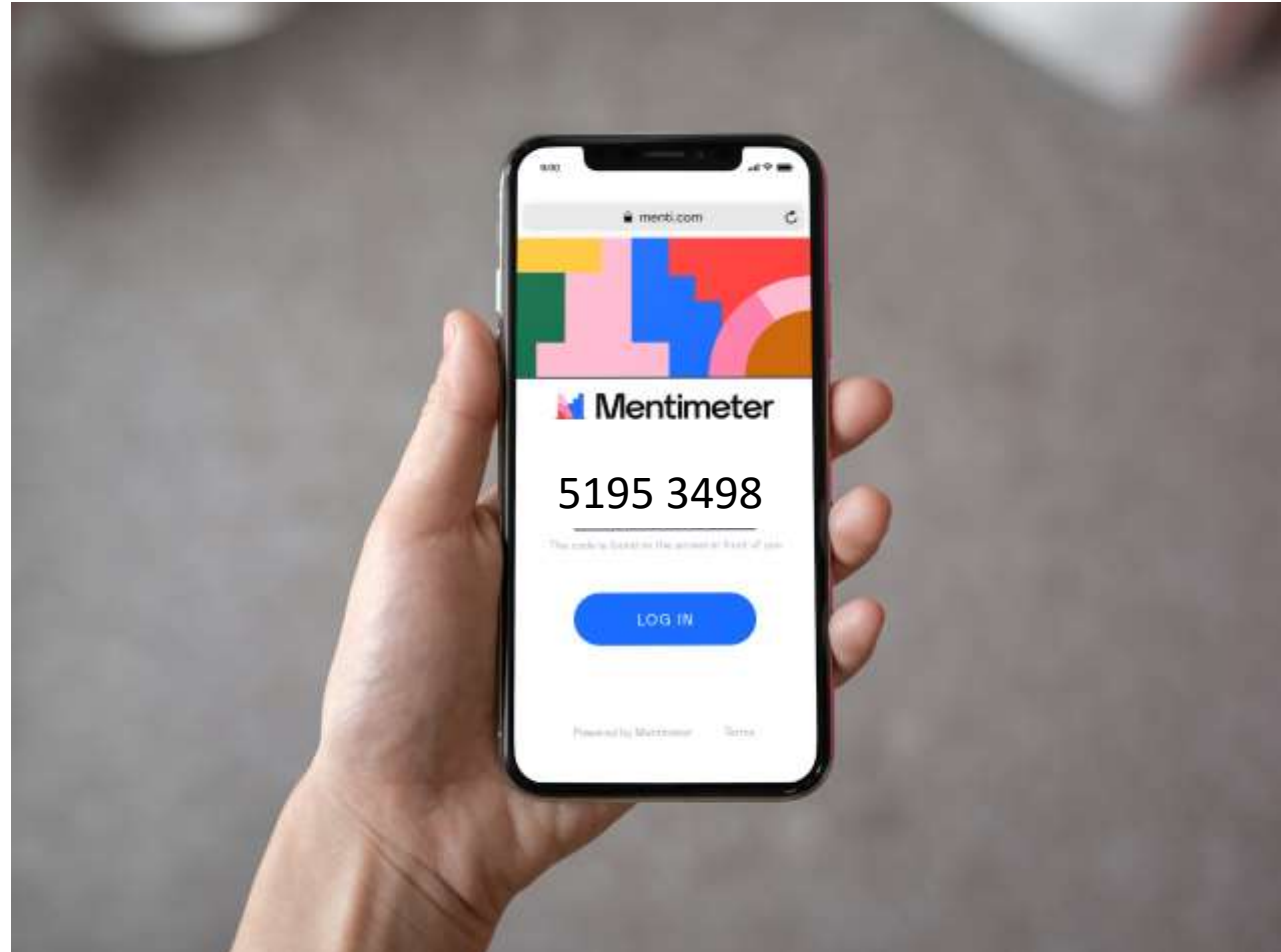

Many people recognizing the importance of process

Courage and moral clarity of the speakers

Change can be made from all levels, from all people, and from all communities. Power can be achieved, even when it is not given.

Hearing lived experiences

Sometimes you have to call people out

"Community learned from the scientists, and scientists learned from the community."

Having courage to speak up

Giving things breathing room

Calling out the wrongs that have been done by decision makers historically.

Building Relationships and trust

"Don't ever let somebody tell you what you can't do or go up against." - re: stopping the coal plant

The perseverance and strength of community and joining together

Patience

Hard work takes time. Put in the time, effort into understanding, listening with an open heart and mind.

Intentional listening and learning

Hearing the wins! And also appreciated the point to let it breathe- that trust and relationships take time

Community organizing and connecting to power

Stop coal

The deeply intersectional and relational approaches to adaptation

Really struck by how transformative, future oriented work is grounded in an understanding of and contact with the past

Reciprocity can and should take place throughout the project (at ALL phases!)

Successful intersectional collaborations

Good things take time

That the stories and efforts shared were truly community-led

Going big but also allowing for slowness

Wood pellets! I'm going to go back and look at our smoke strategy and make sure we aren't doing harm there

long term coalition building

Remaining focused on transformation in the face of resistance and incremental progress

If it isn't a just climate action, it isn't transformative

showing up daily, doing the work, being dogged incrementally, leads to sudden transformation.

Speaking truth to power

Alternative (non-climate-centered) stories of hope

When you're doing work that's meant to push our current limitations, being told "no" doesn't mean you're on the wrong track!

Leaving breathing room for transformation-- change takes time to see

Context matters!

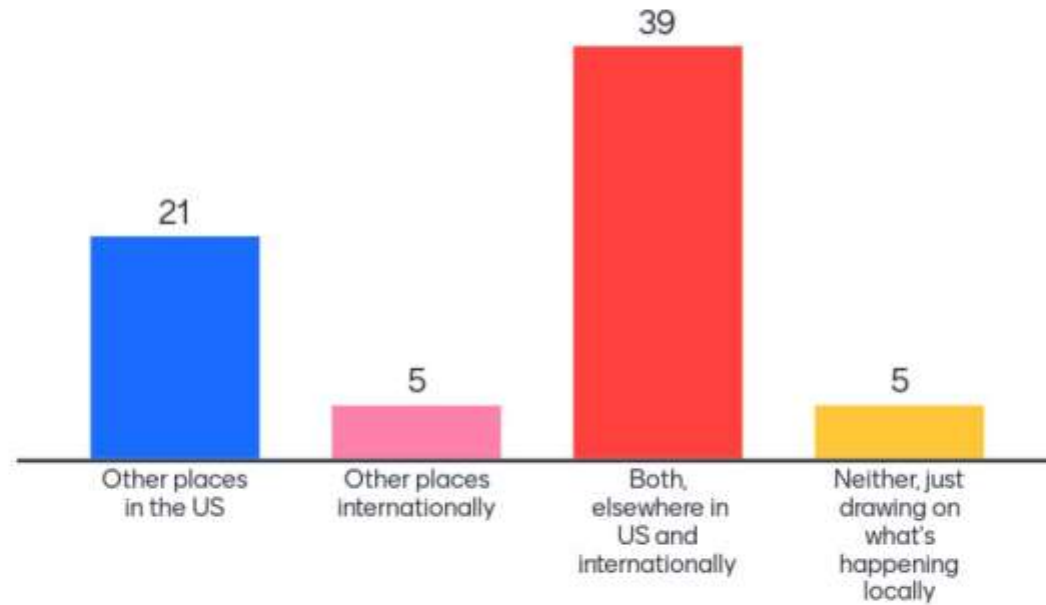
